

GUIDELINES TO WRITING A RESEARCH PROPOSAL FOR COLLOQUIUM

Please write a brief research proposal (i.e. 10-20 pages) with the following structure:

a) Cover Page

The cover page should consist of the following items: the proposal's title, student's name, name of supervisor(s), and date of colloquium.

b) Proposal

The structure of the proposal is as follows:

- 1. Background of the Study
- 2. Problem Statement
- 3. Research Questions
- 4. Research Objectives
- 5. Significance of the Study
- 6. Scope of the Study
- 7. Brief Review of the Literature (i.e. what the literature says about the problem/issue under investigation and where the existing work fails)
- 8. Novelty of the Study
- 9. Methodology of the Study
- 10. References

Notes on Expectations:

- a) A research proposal should be anchored with a strong problem statement, which provides a strong justification for the proposed research.
- b) A PhD proposal should demonstrate originality of research ideas (not a mere replication of previous studies).
- c) Be sure to discuss your proposal with your supervisor(s) prior to submission for the colloquium.

Notes on Format:

- c) Write the proposal in a double-spaced format.
- d) Use Times New Roman font type with 12 font size throughout the paper.
- e) Follow the latest APA style in writing citations, references, and quotations.
